# About the investor visit program

Join the **Broadband and Digital Economy investor visit program**, led by Austrade and in partnership with the Queensland State Government and other Australian State Governments, to receive market intelligence and information on developing opportunities around the Australian National Broadband Network (NBN), Australia's largest ever infrastructure project, and investment and R&D opportunities available in this sector.

The program includes briefings by state governments, Australia's ICT Centre of Excellence - National ICT Australia, and the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO).

# **Attend the World Computer Congress:**

The International Federation for Information Processing's (IFIP) will hold the 21<sup>st</sup> *World Computer Congress 2010* (WCC2010) in Brisbane, Australia from 20 to 23 September 2010. The WCC is the IFIP's main global event, typically attended by up to 1,500 delegates. Other major cities to host the WCC this decade included Beijing, China (2000), Montreal, Canada (2002), Toulouse, France (2004), Santiago, Chile (2006) and Milan, Italy (2008).

The WCC2010 in Brisbane will provide an unparalleled opportunity to network with international peers and experts. To accommodate the wide range of interests represented at WCC2010, the program is built around the following eight *Streams*:

- "GovernIT". Dedicated to leveraging developments in ICT governance, professionalism and e-government initiatives
- "SustainIT": Explores how IT can reduce carbon footprints by embracing responsible & sustainable business practices
- "Value IT": Offers ways to improve profitability through optimisation of value to clients, stakeholders and customers
- "LearnIT": Aims to improve workforce skills by capitalising on leading IT education, e-learning, research and recruitment strategies
- "Deliver IT": Explores the leading IT delivery strategies, methodologies and research
- "PlayIT": Provides a digital learning playground for delegates and local public alike
- "TrustIT": Uncovers the latest information on IT security and threats
- "TreatIT": Accelerates the global health IT transformation

### Australian National Broadband Network (NBN) project insights

- With Australia recording the highest number of internet users per 1000 people in the Asia Pacific, trialing smartgrids and undergoing healthcare reform, high speed broadband is increasingly essential to the way Australians communicate, and do business.
- The NBN is expected to underpin future productivity growth and Australia's international
  competitiveness, by stimulating innovation across industries. The NBN is expected to transform
  service delivery across sectors including education, health, energy, security, transportation,
  government services, emergency services, entertainment services, etc.
- The Australian Government announced on 7 April 2009 it would establish a new company to deliver highspeed broadband to Australian homes and workplaces. The Government is investing up to \$43 billion and has established NBN Co Limited to build and operate the network.
- The NBN will (subject to final design) connect 90 percent of all Australian homes, schools and workplaces with broadband services with speeds of at least 100 megabits per second.
- Opportunities exist to use Australia as a base for R&D into innovative applications and services, and attract government support for eligible research activities. The NBN infrastructure will underpin development of Australia's digital economy. Delegates can explore partnership and collaboration opportunities with Australia's research agencies NICTA and CSIRO, and other research centres.

# Why Australia for ICT

#### A large, sophisticated ICT industry

Australia's highly skilled workforce and sophisticated R&D infrastructure has enabled it to develop a globally competitive ICT industry. The industry comprises more than 30,300 businesses which in 2008 generated in excess of A\$120 billion. In the five years to 2008, the industry's annual growth rate averaged 12.8 per cent – outstripping that of Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, South Korea and Taiwan.

#### Uniquely positioned

Leading international companies see Australia as an ideal location to develop and test new products and services. Companies benefit from Australia's robust intellectual property regime and large, technology-savvy customer base. Many world recognised brands are already taking advantage of what Australia has to offer in technology using it as a base for their product and application development, content development, technical assistance and global sourcing facilities. # Highly developed R&D infrastructure

Australia has a sophisticated network of ICT facilities, run primarily through the private sector and supported by Government and universities. The Government is seeking to introduce a new R&D Tax Credit, providing a 45 per cent refundable credit to firms with an annual turnover of less than A\$20 million, and a 40 per cent non-refundable credit to firms with a turnover of more than A\$20 million.
